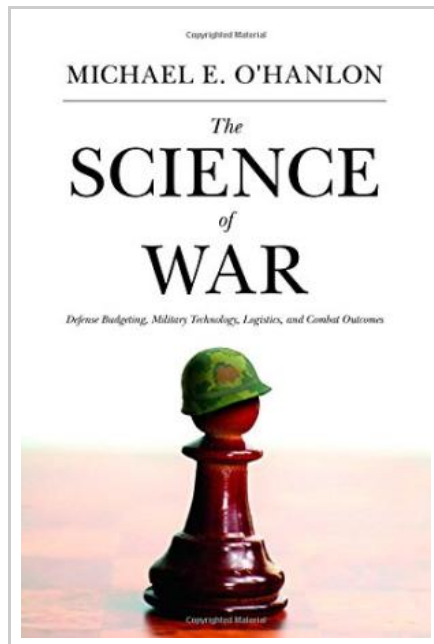




The Science of War: Defense Budgeting, Military Technology, Logistics, and Combat Outcomes (Paperback)
