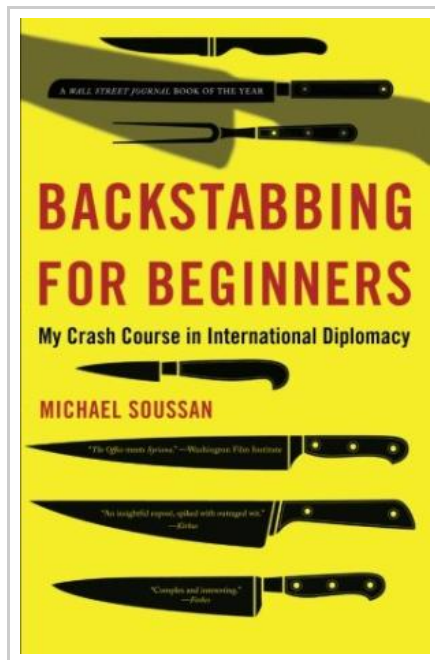




Backstabbing for Beginners: My Crash Course in International Diplomacy (Paperback)
